Fifty years ago this month, Winston Churchill died; Joe Namath signed with the New York Jets for a then-record \$427,000 over three years; and *Beatles '65* (including "I Feel Fine") was number one on the *Billboard* album charts. On campus, Cosmo Iacavazzi '65 also signed with the Jets for Joe Namath "pocket change;" and the *Daily Princetonian* parody issue reported that Bill Bradley '65 had been "booted-out" for drug use and for throwing the Cornell game.

We are writing to urge you to return to campus for a walk down your own undergraduate memory lane and for a memorable celebration of the 100th Anniversary of Alumni Day on Saturday, February 21st.

This year for the first time, Alumni Day activities will kick off on Friday afternoon and continue with the traditional full day of events on Saturday, including lectures, workshops, demonstrations and tours, art exhibits, athletic events, and performances in the lively arts – plus our annual class dinner. 11:30 a.m. – Reception, Luncheon and Awards Ceremony at Jadwin Gymnasium

During this event various will be presented to distinguished undergraduate and graduate school alums, including the Woodrow Wilson Award to Her Majesty Queen Noor (Lisa Najeeb Halaby '73) and the Madison Medal to Martin Eakes '80 (CEO, Self-Help/Center for Responsible Lending), as well as the Pyne Prize and Jacobus Fellowships to current outstanding undergraduate and graduate students, respectively. 3:00 p.m. – Service of Remembrance at the Princeton University Chapel

First held in 1919, this year's Service of Remembrance will honor those Princetonians whose deaths were recorded in 2014, including the following members of the Class of 1966: Daniel H. Carmichael, James V. Davis, Richard E. Fitzpatrick, Fred A. Hargadon '66, Eric Hung Mun Lee, Anthony J. McEwan, Ronald Weinstein, William G. Wetzell and Peter C. Wylie. Each class is represented in the Memorial Procession, and our representative this year will be Kearney Shanahan. We urge as many of you as possible to join us for what is always a sobering and uplifting service at which Princeton honors its own.

4:30 p.m. – Class Reception and Dinner at the Nassau Club

Please join us for our traditional class reception and dinner at the Nassau Club (6 Mercer Street), a short walk from the Chapel. We will be joined by Class of 1966 children on campus, officers of the Class of 2016 (our Grandchild Class), recipients of our Endowed Scholarships and scholarships established by individual classmates (almost all of whom are '16ers), and class-sponsored Princeton Prize in Race Relations winners currently attending Princeton. We have also invited the widows/partners of classmates recognized at the Service of Remembrance to join us as our guests at the luncheon and the dinner. This year the event will feature a presentation by our own Jeff Shafer, former Under Secretary of the U.S. Treasury for International Affairs and Vice Chairman of Citigroup Global Banking. His timely topic will be "The 2008 financial crisis and what had followed: has Dodd-Frank fixed the risks in the system and where are market forces and politics taking us?"

The cost for this always-enjoyable event is \$75 per person, which includes an open bar during cocktail hour and wine with the buffet meal.
