• **The Princeton Prize in Race Relations Senior Thesis Prize.** The Princeton Prize in Race Relations Senior Thesis Prize, endowed by the Class of 1966, is awarded annually to a member of the senior class, irrespective of his or her academic concentration, whose senior thesis adds significantly to our understanding of issues of race and race relations in the United States, broadly defined. While a Prize-winning thesis may rely on conventional research methodologies (in libraries and archives, using the research methodologies of the humanities and the social sciences), the Program in American Studies will look with favor on theses that also manage to draw this scholarship into practical and experimental engagement.
